

HOW IT WORKS:

Lots of schools, clubs, companies or organisations choose to hold Sal's Shoes collections for donations of preloved or new shoes as a way to give back and encourage community spirit. We rehome all styles and sizes of practical footwear (adults and children's), but do not collect high heels. We ask that your Sal's Shoes be outgrown but not outworn, have laces if they need them, have no holes in soles and be clean enough to set off straight to their new owners (often a wet cloth wiped over them will suffice).







WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO ORGANISE A COLLECTION:

Decide when your collection will be - we can accept delivery of your collections throughout the year. Many schools collect at the end of the summer term, but we also have plenty of schools, clubs and organisations that collect at other times of the year.

Decide who will be responsible for collecting, cleaning, rubber banding, counting, sorting, packing, labelling, and posting/delivering your Sal's Shoes.

Spread the word – it's important to let your community know about the collection ahead of time so that they can start sorting their shoes and maybe even ask friends or family to get donating too. You can download a variety of resources from the online resources section on our website, which can be used to create marketing for your collection. If you are organising a larger collection and would like to create 'shoe bins' or collection stations then we can supply vinyl stickers, please email us with your requests: **infoesalsshoes.com**

We spend our limited funds on sending your shoes to their new owners, which can sometimes be as far away as 10,000 miles. For this reason, we ask you to collect a donation of £1/pair where possible. As we also require you to fund the cost of delivery to Sal's Shoes HQ in Kent, we have found that many of you like to organise fundraisers alongside the collections to raise money to fund these costs - this could be a cake sale, an own clothes or shoes day or another sponsored activity, such as a fun run!
